

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



HARSUGUDA A Hidden Gem

Maa Ramchandi Temple: Situated inside a natural rock on the banks of the River Ib, the Maa Ram Chandi Temple is four kilometres away from Brajrajnagar and 20 km away from Jharsuguda railway station. Here, one can catch a glimpse of the beautiful surroundings on the banks of the River Ib.









TANTALISE YOUR TASTE BUDS

Dalma: The flagship food of Odisha, Dalma is food for the soul made from lentils, green vegetables, raw bananas, and a hint of grated coconut. This popular delicacy is available at most restaurants across the state.

Maccha Besara: Maccha Besara is for seafood lovers. This is a fish curry prepared using mustard paste and grated coconut. This popular fish delicacy attracts seafood lovers from far and wide.

Chhena Poda: Chhena Poda is a traditional Odia dessert that translates to 'burnt cheese'. Its ingredients include fresh cottage cheese, sugar, and ghee. The delicacy is baked for several hours until it turns brown and its flavour is derived predominantly from the caramelisation of sugar.

Koilighugar Waterfall: This waterfall is located 30 kilometres from Belpahar and makes for an ideal picnic spot. The best time to visit this place is during winter when fishing is not allowed.

Bikramkhol Caves: Bikramhol Caves is a prehistoric archaeological site known for prehistoric inscriptions. Located at a distance of about 35 kilometres from Jharsuguda, there was an evolution of civilisation in the region in 4000 BC and they developed a script and engraved it on the walls of the caves.

TIME IT RIGHT

Since the state of Odisha is known for its hot and humid climate, the best time to visit Jharsuguda is during the winter months from November to February. During this period, one can visit all the above-mentioned places and have a memorable trip.

KNOW YOUR CITY







The aim is to grow the fleet to 25 aircraft within the next 36 months, solidifying our position as a key player in connecting India's underserved regions. Currently operating nine aircraft—a mix of four Embraer E175s and five Embraer E145s—we are preparing to induct two new E175 aircraft in the current fiscal year (FY25) and another four in FY26. This move underscores our unwavering commitment to the Government of India's UDAN (Ude Desh ka Aam Naagrik) initiative, which focuses on enhancing connectivity to smaller cities and towns.

Our mission to "Connect Real India" remains at the heart of this growth strategy. The addition of new E175s will enable us to boost capacity and efficiency across existing and upcoming routes, while also reinforcing our ability to provide better connectivity to Tier 2 and Tier 3 cities. Known for their fuel efficiency and superior passenger comfort, these aircraft align seamlessly with our promise of providing swift, comfortable, and reliable air travel experiences.

THIS IS YOUR CAPTAIN SPEAKING

Captain **Piyush Chordiya** is a seasoned aviation professional with a wealth of experience in the aviation industry. In a candid conversation with *The Rising Star*, he looks back on his journey so far and sheds light on how Star Air has evolved over the years and shares some invaluable advice for aspiring pilots.

Early years, childhood, family background, etc-What inspired you to take up a career in aviation?

A. I was born and raised in Pune, Maharashtra. With my father being in business in the automobile industry and my elder brother studying engineering, I was naturally inclined towards technical studies and ended up graduating with a degree in industrial engineering. During the later years of engineering studies, I was engaged in studying aerospace-related technology, it was then when aviation got my attention as a career choice. My lust for travel and fascination for fast machines ultimately landed me at a flight school in Canada to pursue a career in flying and earning my commercial pilot license.

From the lower ranks to a captain, could you please take us through your journey with Star Air to date?

A. After earning my wings, I started off as a flight instructor at a flight school in Canada. I spent a couple of years training new students toward their commercial pilot licenses and ratings before shifting my focus to entering the workforce in India. I spent the next 12 years in Indian Aviation learning skills, and knowledge and gaining experience flying various types of aircrafts engaged in Corporate Aviation, cargo, and passenger operations in different geographic areas of operation. During this time I got my first command in corporate aviation and in subsequent years I was employed as a Captain with one of the major airlines in India. The Pandemic altered my path and I happened to explore an opportunity With Star Air in 2022. Under the leadership and vision of Honorable Chairman Shri

Sanjay Ghodawat and M.D. Shrenik Ghodawat to connect Real India, Star Air was rising and expanding. I applied to Star Air and secured a position as a captain on their Embraer 145 fleet.





Could you please take us through what does a day in the life of a pilot looks like?

A. Depending on which type of operation a pilot is engaged, a day in life could be very different. For example, a day of a long-haul pilot or an overnight cargo pilot could be very different from a day of a regional pilot.

At Star Air, we currently follow a 2-shift pattern. A pilot could be scheduled for a morning shift or an afternoon shift spanning about 10 to 12 hours. We would arrive at the airport about 1 hour before the departure time of our flight. We are then subject to a breath analyser test after which we will gather in a dispatch office where we meet and greet the other flight crew and cabin crew teamed up for the shift.

We would discuss the weather, aircraft technical status, operational documents, and any expected hurdles for the day. Once the briefing is done, we head out to the aircraft and carry on with our role-specific tasks like exterior inspection, setting up of the flight deck computers and instruments, etc. Simultaneously, other teams would be boarding the passengers, fueling the aircraft, loading cargo, etc. It's like the clockwork of different teams to get the aircraft airborne in time.

Once we land at our destination it's action replay! In about 20 to 30 minutes on the ground, we would be on to the next sector! We would either return to our home base on the same day or end up on a layover in a different city after a few such sectors depending on the flight pattern.

As a captain, you're often expected to put your professional commitments ahead of your commitments, could you recount one such incident?

A. At Star Air, fortunately up until now I have been able to balance my work

and life commitments-Touch wood! However, I can say that as a pilot you cannot do everything and cannot be everywhere at the same time. Along with the support of colleagues, prioritising between your commitments, social events, etc. is the key to balancing your work-life situation.

Could you please take us through your experience of working with Star Air to date.

A. Star Air in its current setup has been a fulfilling experience so far, offering recognition, growth opportunities, worklife balance, and open communication channels.

Every now and then, we hear stories about unruly flyers on board a flight. Have you had any encounters with unruly passengers as a pilot and how did you deal with them?

A. Fortunately, I haven't personally come across a situation with an unruly passenger on board. However, there are strict regulations and procedures in place to deal with unruly passengers.

Could you please tell us how you have evolved at Star Air over the years?

A. As a regional carrier we fly to smaller regional airports with limited navigation Infrastructure and often shorter runways. This, in comparison to flying in bigger airports, can get challenging and test your piloting abilities. Flying at Star Air provides ample opportunity to sharpen my piloting skills at such airports. I have been able to expand my operational envelope in the



commanding position of a Jet Aircraft, allowing me to develop my analytical traits further. Coming from a major airline, I have been able to share my experience and knowledge with my juniors in a mentorship role which is satisfying and an opportunity to test my communication skills and my ability to guide.

Finally, do you have any advice for budding pilots?

▲. What you aspire will transpire! Having said that, a career in flying requires lifestyle changes and financial considerations. Reality vs expectations can take time to match depending on the economic cycles. Do not compromise on the quality of the flying school you choose for training; this can have a lasting effect! Invest in alternate skills as a backup. ★

Crispy Chusela: The Rice Flour Revelation





Tip: Serve macho torkari with hot rice to fully appreciate its robust, tangy depth.









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
