MALUKA MELA Where: Jodhpur, Rajasthan When: 11 May 2025

The famous Maluka Fair is organised on the occasion of Vaishakh Shukla Chaturdashi (Narsing Chaudas) in the Gangshyam Ji Temple located in Jodhpur, which sees the participation of thousands of devotees, local residents and tourists. According to mythological beliefs, on this day, Lord Vishnu took the form of Narasimha to protect his devotee Prahlad and killed Hiranyakashyap. Local devotees don the roles of Hiranyakashyap, Bhakt Prahlad and Lord Vishnu and entertain the devotees by enacting the time-treasured episode outside the temple.

Explore the unique culture and lose yourself in the magic of these upcoming festivals

SENDRA Where: Dalma, Jharkhand When: 15 May – 29 May 2025

An important sports and adventure festival, it involves martial arts and hunting. During the festival, tribals perform the ritual of hunting in the forests of the Dalma Mountains near Jamshedpur. It usually falls in the month of May, with activities including archery, dance and rituals. Jharkhand, a land of festivals, also celebrates many other special days, including Kuti Dahan Puja, Buru Festival, Magh Festival, Bora Balounji Festival, Hero-Anga Festival, Rog Khedna Festival, Ba Festival, and Ayyappa Puja.





SHIMLA SUMMER FESTIVAL Where: Shimla, Himachal Pradesh When: June 2025

The former summer capital of British India, Shimla has a rare legacy of built heritage and is surrounded by the natural wealth of thick forests of pine, Himalayan oak, flowering Rhododendron and tall cedars-the 'almost-legendary' deodar trees. The annual Shimla Summer Festival, held in the last week of May/ first week of June every year since 1960, includes cultural evenings, music performances, star nights, flower shows, painting competitions, and more. Also a bouquet of the state's cultural diversity, it is a platform for a display of local talent.



MOUNT ABU SUMMER **FESTIVAL** Where: Mount Abu, Rajasthan

When: May 2025 Rajasthan's only hill station - Mount Abu with its verdant hills and lakes provides respite in the harsh summer. Its unique summer festival, starting on the day of Buddha Poornima, celebrates the vibrancy of Rajasthani culture over three days. Soulful ballad singing kicks off the summer festival in style, followed by mesmerising folk dance styles of Gair, Ghoomar and Daph. The Sham-e-Qawwali features some of the best folk singers from various parts of India. Along with a colourful showcase of folk culture, the festival also hosts horse racing events, tug of war, skating races, CRPF band show and boat races on the Nakki Lake, concluding with a dazzling display of fireworks.

The iconic Ooty Summer Festival is celebrated every year in the Queen of Hills, Ooty, during the month of May. Where Stones Speak Stories

Renowned as the 'City of Whispering Monuments', Bidar offers a timeless journey through culture, history, and heritage

estled in northern Karnataka, just 150 km from Hyderabad, lies Bidar, a hidden gem. Teeming with grand forts, sacred sites, vibrant markets, and rich history, Bidar invites you to explore a side of India few have truly seen.

Rooted in History

Bidar's origins stretch back over two thousand years, tracing its roots to the Mauryan Empire in the 3rd century BCE. Over the centuries, the city saw the rise of powerful dynasties like the Bahmani Sultanate, Barid Shahi, and the Mughals, each leaving a lasting imprint on its architecture and culture.

Architectural Wonders

The majestic Bidar Fort, built in the 14th century by the Bahmani rulers, is a sprawling complex of palaces, mosques, gardens, and water tanks a masterpiece of Islamic architecture. Close by stands the Rangeen Mahal, famed for its vibrant frescoes, intricate stucco work, and delicate carvings, making it a true visual feast for history lovers.





Sacred Sites & Spiritual Stories

Bidar's spiritual landscape is as rich as its history. The Papnash Temple, believed to be linked to Lord Rama, holds mythological significance. It is said Rama worshipped Lord Shiva here to atone for killing Ravana, a Brahmin. The newer temple now stands where the original once was.

The city also honours Guru Nanak Dev Ji at the Gurudwara Nanak Jhira Sahib, built at the site where a miraculous spring burst forth during a famine. The crystal-clear water still flows, believed by devotees to have healing powers. Another spiritual highlight is the Shrine of Hazrat Khalil Ullah, dedicated to a revered Sufi saint, drawing seekers from all backgrounds.

Culture, Cuisine, Celebrations

Though part of Karnataka, Bidar shares cultural influences with neighbouring Andhra Pradesh and Maharashtra, creating a unique blend reflected in its food and festivals. The local cuisine – from Bidri biryani to Bidri qalia – is a delightful mix of flavours.

Festivals are celebrated with great spirit. The Urs or Jaathre Mahotsav commemorates Sultan Ahmad Shah Bahmani, while the Veerabhadreshwara Jatra sees thousands of devotees walk to Humnabad's Shiva temple. The Bidar Utsav, held at the fort, features a blend of traditional and modern events, including kite flying, film screenings, and wrestling competitions.

Tracing its roots to the Mauryan empire, Bidar has seen the rise of powerful dynasties like the Bahmani Sultanate, Barid Shahi and the Mughals



Modern Marvels & Market Treasures

Adding a modern edge to the city is the Surya Kiran Aerobatics Team (SKAT) – the Indian Air Force's elite squad based in Bidar. On lucky days, visitors can witness their breathtaking stunts in the sky.

No trip to Bidar is complete without exploring its markets. The city is famous for Bidriware – exquisite metalcraft with silver and gold inlays – a true symbol



of Bidar's artisanal legacy. Alongside, travellers can find handloom textiles, wood carvings, and souvenirs that reflect the city's cultural soul.

Must-see Marvels Bidar Fort: Where History Stands Tall

Just 2.5 km from Bidar Railway Station, Bidar Fort is one of Karnataka's most awe-inspiring heritage sites. Originally built during the Western Chalukya period, it was Sultan Ahmed Shah Wali of the Bahmani Sultanate who rebuilt it in 1430, turning Bidar into a royal capital.

A masterpiece of Persian-inspired architecture, the fort stretches over three miles with triple moats, 37 massive bastions, and imposing red laterite walls. Structures like the Rangeen Mahal, with its vibrant tile work and frescoes, and the Gagan Mahal, once a royal residence, reflect the grandeur of the Bahmani dynasty. Mosques like the Solah Khamba and Jami Masjid add to the cultural richness.





coldest and wettest place. November to February is the best period to visit Bidar.

Flash Fact: Bidar gives its name to Bidriware and is still its chief centre of production. Developed in the 14th century during the rule of the Bahmani Sultans, it uses white brass that is blackened and inlaid with silver. The craft has found its way into jewellery, and home décor. In 2003, Bidriware obtained a Geographical Indication (GI)

tranguil sarovar (lake) and the Amrut Kunda (sweet water pond), which add a unique spiritual depth to the experience. At the heart of the gurudwara lies the Sukhaasan Room, where the Guru Granth Sahib is venerated, providing solace to visitors through prayer and meditation. The attached Sikh Museum showcases rich historical artifacts, offering a deeper understanding of Sikhism and its prominent figures. According to legend, during a famine, Guru Nanak Devji performed a miracle by causing a freshwater spring to emerge from the laterite mountain, which is believed to have healing properties, attracting many to drink its waters for relief. Guru Nanak Jhira Sahib welcomes all, offering accommodation and langar (community kitchen) for pilgrims. Visitors can engage in spiritual practices, volunteer, or simply enjoy the peaceful atmosphere of this sacred space. 🖈

Within the fort lies Bidar's old city. a treasure trove of monuments. legends, and markets. The fort even withstood Mughal attacks, including one by Emperor Aurangzeb, before finally yielding to fire rockets.

Bahmani Tombs: Timeless Beauty

In the heart of Bidar, the Bahmani Tombs built between 1436 and 1535 are a testament to the grandeur of the Bahmani Sultanate. These stunning mausoleums offer a unique fusion of Persian and Indian architectural styles. With their graceful domes, decorative arches, and symmetrical layouts, the tombs embody elegance and timelessness. Among the many tombs, the graves of Ahmad Shah and Alauddin Shah II stand out due to their grandeur. Also of interest is the partially collapsed tomb of Humayun Shah, Alauddin's son, which was struck by lightning. Each year, the tombs host the Urs (Jatra), a month-long event that draws both Hindu and Muslim visitors in celebration.

Kalvani Chalukva Temple: **Divine Splendour**

A magnificent testament to the architectural brilliance and spiritual depth of the Chalukya dynasty. Built during the rule of Vikramaditya VI, it blends intricate carvings and sculptures with divine symbolism. Its grand design represents the connection between earth and heaven, offering visitors a serene, spiritual experience. The temple's main sanctum is crowned with a stunning vimana (tower) adorned with detailed carvings of gods, goddesses, and mythological scenes. The mandapa (hall) features exquisitely crafted pillars, showcasing the dynasty's skill in sculpture. Intricate motifs of flowers, animals, and celestial beings tell stories of the divine and everyday life. Its breathtaking architecture continues to enchant visitors and spiritual seekers alike.

Guru Nanak Jhira Sahib: Sacred Space

A revered Sikh Gurudwara dedicated to Guru Nanak Dev, it offers a peaceful retreat for both spiritual seekers and history enthusiasts. The gurudwara is set in a serene environment, featuring a

Meanwhile, the Gulbarga Utsav lights up the city with traditional dance, music, and folk performances a true showcase of North Karnataka's rich cultural landscape.

Food lovers, rejoice! Kalaburagi's cuisine is a feast of bold flavours and comforting traditions. Sample the rustic Jolada Roti with spicy chutney, savour the rich Enne Gai, or indulge in sweet Bele Holige, stuffed with lentils and jaggery. Don't miss Tahari, a fragrant rice and vegetable dish unique to this region — a hearty alternative to biryani.

Spots you shouldn't miss...

- Gulbarga Fort A striking symbol of Karnataka's mediaeval heritage, it was originally built in the 12th century by Raja Gulchand and later expanded by the Bahmani Sultanate in the 14th century. The fort blends Hindu and Islamic architectural styles. Perched atop a granite hill, it features massive walls, bastions, mosques, palaces, and intricately carved gateways. Once the Bahmani capital, the fort played a key role in regional politics and defence. Its design reflects strategic brilliance and cultural fusion, making it one of the Deccan's most significant historical and architectural landmarks.
- Buddha Vihar A sanctuary of tranquility dedicated to the teachings of Lord Buddha, the complex weaves together architectural elements inspired by renowned Buddhist centres like Sanchi, Sarnath, Ajanta, and Nagpur, all while staying true to the principles of traditional Buddhist design.
- Dargah Khwaja Banda Nawaz A vibrant and sacred site, the tomb of Khwaja Banda Nawaz is deeply rooted in Sufi spirituality. A stunning example of Islamic architecture, its grand dome, intricate carvings, and peaceful courtyards offer a haven for reflection and prayer.
- Sharana Basaveshwara Temple This serene temple is dedicated to Shri Sharana Basaveshwara, who was an eminent teacher, philosopher and saint in the Hindu religion. . *






Spiti Valley (Himachal Pradesh)

A high-altitude desert wrapped in snow-capped peaks, Spiti offers dramatic landscapes and age-old monasteries like Key Gompa. Less commercial than Ladakh, it's ideal for adventurers and culture lovers seeking raw Himalayan beauty.



Lidder Valley (Kashmir)

A quiet offshoot of Pahalgam, Lidder Valley is a haven of alpine meadows, pine forests, and riverbanks perfect for nature walks, trout fishing, and camping in peaceful surroundings.



Khajjiar & Dalhousie (Himachal Pradesh)

Its lush meadows and cedar forests have earned Khajjiar the nickname 'Mini Switzerland.' Nearby Dalhousie enchants with its colonial architecture, scenic viewpoints, and serene charm-perfect for a relaxed summer holiday.



Lahaul Valley (Himachal Pradesh)

Now easily accessible via the Atal Tunnel, Lahaul boasts surreal alpine views, glacial rivers, and rich Buddhist heritage. Ideal for travellers looking to disconnect and immerse themselves in pristine nature.

Doodhpathri (Kashmir)

Translating to 'Valley of Milk,' Doodhpathri is an untouched gem near Srinagar with rolling meadows, pine-covered slopes, and gentle streams—ideal for picnics and quiet getaways.

Mawlynnong (Meghalaya)

Titled 'Asia's Cleanest Village', Mawlynnong is a model of eco-tourism. Enjoy the living root bridges, waterfalls, bamboo skywalks, and a peek into Khasi village life in this enchanting green haven.

Dharamshala & McLeod Ganj (Himachal Pradesh)

I was also drawn to the professionalism and grace of flight attendants. Ultimately, I wanted a career that was dynamic, meaningful and allowed me to grow while making a positive impact on others' journey – and being a flight attendant ticks all those boxes.

Challenges & Rewards

Training, teamwork, and ability to stay calm under pressure are essential. I've also had heartwarming moments, like celebrating birthdays onboard, calming crying babies, comforting a nervous flyer and watching them relax by the end of the journey. It's those small, genuine connections that make all the challenges worth it.

This job definitely comes with pressure, but the sense of purpose and the ability



to make a difference–whether big or small–makes it incredibly rewarding. Advice to the Aspiring

Always lead with empathy and adaptability. This career is more than just travelling—it's about people. Every passenger has a different story, and being able to remain calm, compassionate, and professional no matter the situation is what truly sets you apart. Your attitude and resilience will carry you further than anything else.

Work-life Balance

Managing work-life balance with long flights requires intentional effort and self-awareness. I prioritise rest and recovery during my days off and make the most of my time off by staying connected with loved ones, pursuing hobbies, and maintaining a healthy routine. Setting boundaries, practicing good sleep hygiene, and making space for mental wellness are key. It's about quality over quantity when it comes to downtime, and learning to be present both on and off duty helps me stay grounded and energised.

Safety - A Top Priority

Cabin crew are frontline safety professionals, not just service providers. We play a crucial role in maintaining a robust safety culture by being vigilant, well-trained, and consistently prepared for emergencies. Our responsibilities include enforcing safety procedures, conducting pre-flight checks, monitoring passenger behavior, and responding swiftly and effectively to any in-flight incidents.

Regular refresher training, scenariobased drills, feedback sessions, and staying updated with evolving aviation regulations ensure we remain sharp and capable. A strong safety culture thrives when every crew member takes ownership, communicates openly, and supports a mindset where safety is always prioritised.

Blasting Myths

One of the most common

misconceptions about cabin crew is that our job is mainly about serving food and drinks. While service is a part of what we





do, our primary responsibility is ensuring the safety and well-being of everyone on board. We are trained extensively in first aid, emergency procedures, conflict resolution, and crisis management. In critical situations, we are the first responders at 35,000 feet. It's a role that requires resilience, quick thinking, and a high level of professionalism, and it goes far beyond the smile and uniform.

Little Things Matter

Sometimes, it's the smallest gestures by passengers that make the biggest difference. A simple 'thank you,' a smile, or a bit of patience during busy moments can truly brighten a cabin crew member's day. We're there to support passengers, often while managing long hours and high-stress situations, so kindness and understanding go a long way. Just acknowledging our efforts reminds us why we love what we do. **★**



ou can love 'em, you can hate 'em. But you can't ignore them. Electric vehicles, the future of the automotive industry. Regardless of your opinion about them, they're here to stay. And with the way our government is pushing the EV agenda, expect automobiles to turn green sooner than you'd expect.

While I personally haven't been the biggest advocate for EVs, it's difficult to ignore how practical they are. The low cost of living with them combined with the silent ride quality makes them a bliss for daily commutes. And for the enthusiasts, the gutwrenching torque is a thrill that very few ICE (internal combustion engines) can offer.

If you're in the market for an EV today, here are five vehicles that you should definitely be testing before putting down your hard-earned money...

Mahindra XEV 9e

The newest kid on the block impresses and how. Bold lines on this car help it stand out from everything else on the road and once you step in, the futuristic theme continues. It does look inspired from the Tesla Cybertruck and in my opinion, that isn't a bad thing. With the top model priced at ₹32.53 lakh on road in Mumbai and the motor putting out 282 bhp, the Mahindra is a premium offering that's sure to give its rivals a headache. If I were you, I'd head to the nearest Mahindra showroom and test both this and its smaller sibling - the BE 6 to see which one fits best.





Ather 450X

Bajaj's Chetak is a lovely scooter but gets excluded from this list only thanks to the wily Ather. It's been around for a while now but the design refuses to age. It's light on its feet, has few reliability issues and is a no-brainer if you're looking for something to punt around the city. The 100km of real-world range is what justifies its asking price of ₹1.57 lakh. If you're on the larger side or want to haul around some luggage, good to consider its sister the Rizta too.


MG Comet EV

This one's debatable. Primarily because the Comet looks cheap but buying it surprisingly isn't light on the pocket – it costs a whopping ₹10.37 lakh in the financial capital. Avoid the highway, stick to the city and you'll be far happier in this than any other hatchback especially if you're in the rush hour traffic of Mumbai or Bangalore. Don't think of it as a rival to cars, think of it as an upgrade to a motorcycle and this MG adds value by combining the best bits of a two-wheeler and four-wheeler.



Tata Nexon EV

If you're on the fence about EVs in general, just get the Nexon EV. It's been around long enough and it's proven to be just as durable as its ICE counterparts. The safest option and I know of hardcore petrolheads who've taken to this SUV like a fish to water. No gimmicky features here, the electric Tata just focuses on practicality and aces its job. ₹18.09 lakh for the top model means it's not badly priced for all it offers and in my opinion, this is the gateway to EVs if you're in the market for one. ★



Ultraviolette F77

A study in BMJ Heart suggests brisk walking could reduce the risk of arrhythmia, or irregular heartbeats, especially in higherrisk individuals. Researchers tracked over 4.2 lakh UK adults for 13 years and found that those who walked at a brisk pace (over 6.4 km/h) had a 35%–43% lower risk of heart rhythm issues compared to slow walkers. Experts say brisk walking supports the heart's electrical system and keeps it "wellbehaved." It also improves blood pressure, reduces stress, and is an accessible form of preventive care—requiring no gym, just a steady step and regular pace.



OMAD - Karan Johar's Secret

Denying rumours of using medication to lose weight, Karan Johar reveals that he followed the One Meal A Day eating pattern to drop the pounds. OMAD is a type of intermittent fasting where individuals consume all their daily calories in a single meal within a short time window. It's characterised by a long fasting period.
