



The Kutch Rann Utsav, a celebration of Gujarat's vibrant culture and natural beauty, is an annual festival that takes place in the heart of the mesmerizing Rann of Kutch. Known for its white salt desert that stretches to the horizon, the festival here is a unique blend of art, music, crafts, and adventure.



A LESSON IN HISTORY

The Rann of Kutch, once an ancient seabed, is a sprawling salt desert that transforms into a cultural hub during the winter months. The festival was initiated by the Gujarat government to promote tourism and showcase the rich heritage of the Kutch region. It draws inspiration from the nomadic traditions of the Kutchi people, who have long lived in harmony with the stark landscape. The festival has grown over the years into a global event, highlighting the craftsmanship, music, and dance that are intrinsic to the local culture.







KNOW YOUR FESTIVAL

The Kutch Rann Utsav, which lasts for several months from November to February, offers visitors a chance to experience Gujarat's cultural richness. The festival grounds are adorned with beautifully crafted tents, offering a luxurious stay in the middle of the white desert. Each evening comes alive with folk music, dance performances, and storytelling sessions that offer a glimpse into the traditions of the local communities. White Salt Desert: The vast expanse of the salt desert is the main attraction, especially under the full moon, when the entire landscape takes on an ethereal glow. Visitors can take camel rides, engage in photography, or simply stroll along the shimmering surface to take in the beauty of the Rann.

Cultural Performances: Every evening, the festival presents captivating performances of Gujarati folk dances like Garba and Dandiya, accompanied by the soulful sounds of local instruments. These performances offer a chance to experience the vibrant culture of Kutch in its most authentic form.

Handicraft Bazaar: The Kutch region is famous for its handicrafts, including intricate embroidery, Bandhani textiles, and hand-painted pottery. The bazaar at the Rann Utsav is a treasure trove for art lovers, offering a wide range of handmade items crafted by local artisans.




TANTALISE YOUR TASTE BUDS






TRYST WITH NATURE

Wildlife at Kutch: The Rann is home to unique wildlife, including the Indian wild ass, flamingos, and various migratory birds. Visitors can take guided tours through the nearby Wild Ass Sanctuary or the Chari-Dhand Wetlands, perfect for birdwatchers and nature enthusiasts.

Kalo Dungar: Known as the Black Hill, Kalo Dungar is the highest point in Kutch, offering panoramic views of the Rann. The sunset from this vantage point is a sight to behold, with the sun dipping below the vast salt plains, creating a spectacular play of colours.



Passion, Precision & Progress

Wilmer Navas is an experienced aviation professional with over 30 years in the industry. As the Director of Flight Operations at Star Air, he plays a pivotal role in overseeing flight safety, compliance, and fleet expansion. With a distinguished career spanning both military and civilian aviation, Wilmer's passion for flying and mentoring has made him a respected figure in the global aviation community.



Can you briefly walk us through your journey in aviation, starting with your time in the Venezuelan Air Force and leading to your current position at Star Air?

A. I started my aviation career in 1985 by joining the Venezuelan Air Force Military Academy, where I spent four years in rigorous training that laid the foundation for my career. After retiring from the Air Force, I transitioned to commercial aviation with Conviasa Airlines in Venezuela, where I became a B737 instructor and examiner, and later moved on to the Embraer 190. During my time at Conviasa, I held leadership roles as Director of Training and Director

of Operations. My career then took me internationally, working for Air Costa in India, Air Astana in Kazakhstan, Avianca-TACA in El Salvador, and Air Burkina in Burkina Faso. Now, as the Director of Flight Operations at Star Air, I oversee all flight operations, ensuring regulatory compliance and maintaining the highest standards of safety and efficiency.

What inspired you to become a pilot, and how did your career path evolve from military service to commercial aviation?

A. I have always had a passion for aviation, from an early age, I was inspired by the idea of flight and service to my country which led me to join the

Venezuelan Air Force Military Academy in 1985. The military provided me with unique flying experiences that shaped my career. After retirement from the Air Force in 2008 as Lieutenant Colonel, I joined Conviasa Airlines as a B737 instructor and examiner. From there, my career evolved into more leadership and training roles, allowing me to apply my skills in various countries and airlines globally.

What motivated you to move into flight operations management, and how has your military background influenced your approach to leading this department?

A. The structured environment of the Air Force instilled in me a strong sense of responsibility, discipline, and attention to detail, which naturally prepared me for management roles. My experience managing complex military missions as Director of Operations for the Air Transport Group in the Air Force gave me the skills needed to lead flight operations in a commercial environment. The transition to management allowed me to influence airline operations at a higher level, focusing on safety, efficiency, and team leadership. At Star Air, I continue to bring this disciplined and systematic approach to ensure we meet and exceed industry safety standards and regulatory compliance.

What was the most significant challenge you faced when transitioning from military aviation (flying C-130s) to civilian aircraft?

A. The most significant challenge was



adjusting to the different operational demands between military and civilian aviation. In the military, the missions are often complex, and we must operate under more unpredictable conditions, 'any time anywhere' such as flying with night vision goggles or performing tactical operations. Civilian aviation, however, is more standardized and focused on efficiency and passenger comfort. Learning to adapt to the more structured environment of commercial airlines, with its strict schedules, regulations, and customer service requirements, was a big shift, but the discipline and adaptability from my military career helped me navigate this transition successfully.

Can you share any memorable experiences which reflect the challenges and rewards of flying these diverse aircraft?

A. One of the most memorable experiences from my military career was flying the C-130H on special missions using night vision goggles. These missions involved parachute drops, cargo transport, and humanitarian aid, as well including air refueling tankering with the B707 for fighter aircraft, and they required precision, focus, and teamwork. The challenges were high, but the sense of accomplishment was even greater.

Safety is always a top priority in aviation. How do you ensure that Star Air maintains a robust safety culture, and what measures do you believe are critical to continuous improvement?

A. At Star Air, we prioritize safety by fostering a proactive safety culture that is ingrained in every level of the organization. This includes regular safety audits, training programs, and a strong emphasis on reporting safety issues through open communication channels. Continuous improvement is driven by data analysis, flight data monitoring systems, and staying updated with industry best practices. The key to



maintaining a robust safety culture is ensuring that all team members, from pilots to ground staff, are committed to upholding these standards.

Reflecting on your career, what has been the most fulfilling aspect of your journey, from your days in the Venezuelan Air Force to leading Star Air's flight operations?

A. Mentoring and training the next generation of pilots has been one of the most fulfilling aspects of my career. Whether in the military or commercial aviation, sharing my knowledge and

experience with others has always been rewarding. Watching young pilots grow and succeed under my guidance gives me great pride. Additionally, overseeing the expansion of Star Air and ensuring that we maintain a strong safety and operational framework has been a career highlight. However, none of this would have been possible without the unwavering support of my family. My mother, wife, sons and daughter have stood by me throughout my career, even during the times I had to travel extensively. Their encouragement and understanding allowed me to fully dedicate myself to aviation while knowing I had a strong foundation at home. This support has been crucial in my ability to focus, grow, and succeed in my roles across the world.

If you could offer one piece of advice to aspiring pilots or aviation leaders, what would it be?

A. My advice would be to maintain discipline, stay curious, and always prioritize safety. Aviation is a constantly evolving field, and the best pilots and leaders are those who are committed to lifelong learning and improvement. Foster a culture of teamwork and never underestimate the importance of preparation and attention to detail. Most importantly, keep your passion for flying alive-it's the key to staying motivated and excelling in this career.*

Aerial Ambitions: The Ghodawat Aviation Story

In 2004, Ghodawat Aviation took flight, marking the beginning of a new chapter for the Sanjay Ghodawat Group. The Group, already a diverse business entity, expanded its operations by acquiring its first Airbus Helicopter EC 120B Colibri. This strategic move enhanced operational efficiency, allowing the chairman to oversee the Group's vast and growing interests, even in remote areas. The helicopter not only streamlined the oversight process but also contributed to the Group's mission of positively impacting lives across the globe.

As the years passed, Ghodawat Aviation continued to grow and evolve. In 2013, the company introduced a more advanced aircraft to its fleet, the Airbus EC 135 T2+, equipped with state-of-the-art avionics and twin Safran engines in a luxurious VVIP configuration. This marked the company's shift into more formal aviation services, culminating in the acquisition of a Non-Scheduled Operator Permit (NSOP) by 2014. With this permit, Ghodawat Aviation began offering exclusive VVIP charter services during crucial events like elections.

At the same time, the company expanded its capabilities with the introduction of the Airbus EC 130 T2, a helicopter specifically designed to operate at high altitudes. It became the first of its kind in India, playing a key role in transporting pilgrims to sacred destinations like Kedarnath and Badrinath. Recognized for its versatility and safety, Ghodawat Aviation earned accolades from Airbus for its commitment to excellence in operations.

A major turning point came in 2016, when Ghodawat Aviation set its sights on connecting the city of Kolhapur to other major cities in India. Under the leadership of Managing Director Shrenik Ghodawat, the company made the strategic decision to enter the commercial airline market. The Embraer 145 LR aircraft was chosen for its cost-effectiveness and reliability, and in the following years, Ghodawat Aviation acquired five of these aircraft to launch India's first regional airline under the brand STAR AIR.

STAR AIR, born with a mission to connect the often-




overlooked tier 2 and tier 3 cities of India, became an integral part of the government's Regional Connectivity Scheme (UDAN). By focusing on "Connecting Real India," STAR AIR made air travel more affordable and accessible to people in underserved regions, bridging gaps between urban centres and rural areas. This initiative fostered regional connectivity and strengthened local economies, offering citizens in smaller towns a chance to experience the convenience of modern air travel.

The airline's early journey wasn't without challenges. Transitioning from being a Non-Scheduled Operator to a commercial airline required meticulous planning and compliance with stringent regulations. However, STAR AIR's leadership team, headed by CEO Capt. Simran Singh Tiwana, expertly navigated these hurdles. They built a strong foundation based on regulatory compliance, operational efficiency, and customer trust. The choice of Embraer aircraft, in particular, proved to be a game changer, enabling the airline to offer frequent, reliable services on routes larger airlines often ignored.

As STAR AIR expanded its route network, it adapted quickly to the market's changing dynamics. During the COVID-19 pandemic, the airline demonstrated resilience by pivoting to offer charter services, diversifying revenue streams, and maintaining operations during a period of uncertainty. This adaptability helped secure STAR AIR's position as a reliable player in India's aviation sector.

Innovation and operational efficiency remained at the core of STAR AIR's strategy. By expanding its fleet with the more advanced Embraer 175 LR, the airline accessed airports with shorter runways, increasing its ability to serve even more remote destinations.

This passion for flying became a guiding principle for the company, emphasizing the importance of innovation and risk-taking.

Ghodawat Aviation's broader vision included creating comprehensive aviation training programs to prepare the next generation of aviation professionals. This commitment to continuous learning extended to mentoring aeronautical engineering students and offering handson experience through airport visits and On-Job Training (OJT). The company's aviation division, led by experienced professionals, aimed to foster innovation while maintaining the highest standards of safety and service.



Christmas Yule Log

Ingredients

- For the cake:
- o 3/4 cup all-purpose flour
- o ½ cup cocoa powder
- o 1 teaspoon baking powder o Pinch of salt
- o 4 large eggs
- o ¾ cup sugar
- o 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- o Powdered sugar for dusting

For the filling and frosting:

- o 1½ cups heavy whipping cream
- o 1/4 cup powdered sugar
- o 1 teaspoon vanilla extract
- o ½ cup chocolate chips, melted

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C). Line a jelly roll pan (10x15 inches) with parchment paper and lightly grease it.
- 2. In a bowl, whisk together flour, cocoa powder, baking powder, and salt.
- 3. Beat the eggs and sugar in another bowl until thick and pale. Add vanilla extract. Gently fold in the dry ingredients.
- 4. Pour the batter onto the prepared pan and spread evenly. Bake for 10-12 minutes.
- 5. Turn the cake onto a clean kitchen towel dusted with powdered sugar. Roll the cake up with the towel and let it
- 6. For the filling, beat heavy cream, powdered sugar, and vanilla until stiff peaks form. Unroll the cooled cake, spread the cream, and roll it back up.
- 7. For frosting, mix melted chocolate with whipped cream and spread it over the rolled cake. Use a fork to create a log-like texture. Dust with powdered sugar and serve.





Gingerbread Cookies

Ingredients:

- 2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
- ½ cup brown sugar
- ½ cup molasses
- ½ teaspoon baking soda
- 1 teaspoon ground ginger
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon cloves
- ¼ teaspoon nutmeg
- ¼ teaspoon salt
- ½ cup unsalted butter, softened
- 1 tablespoon milk (plant-based works too)
- Icing and sprinkles for decorating

Preparation:

- 1. In a bowl, whisk together flour, ginger, cinnamon, cloves, nutmeg, and salt.
- 2. In another bowl, cream the butter and brown sugar until fluffy. Add molasses and milk, and mix until combined.
- 3. Gradually add the dry ingredients to the wet mixture and form a dough.
- 4. Wrap the dough in a plastic wrap and refrigerate for 1 hour.
- 5. Preheat the oven to 350°F (180°C). Roll out the dough to ¼-inch thickness and cut out shapes using cookie cutters.
- 6. Place the cookies on a baking sheet lined with parchment paper and bake for 8-10 minutes.
- 7. Once cooled, decorate with icing and sprinkles.

Dal Baati Churma:

A traditional Rajasthani dish, Dal Baati Churma is a combination of three elements: dal (spiced lentils), baati (baked wheat dumplings), and churma (a sweet, crumbly dessert). The baati is dipped in ghee and eaten with the hearty dal, while churma adds a sweet finish to the meal. This rustic dish, deeply connected to Rajasthan's desert heritage, is rich, filling, and packed with flavour.



Aloo Posto:

A simple yet flavourful dish from Bengal, **Aloo Posto** is

made from potatoes cooked in a poppy seed paste. The creamy texture of the poppy seeds combined with green chilies and mustard oil gives this dish its distinct flavour. Served with rice, this comforting and mildly spiced dish is a favourite in Bengali households and is known for its unique texture and taste.



Sarson Ka Saag and Makki Ki Roti:

While the northern state of Punjab is known for its rich, hearty dishes, the vegetarian favourite is Sarson Ka Saag and Makki Ki Roti. Sarson ka saag is a thick, green curry made from mustard leaves, spinach, and other leafy greens, spiced and slow-cooked to perfection. It's traditionally paired with makki ki roti, a flatbread made from cornmeal, and served with a dollop of butter or ghee. This dish is especially popular during winter months and is a celebration of seasonal produce.



Masala Dosa:

Masala Dosa is a crispy, golden-brown rice and lentil crepe filled with a spiced potato mixture, served with tangy sambar and coconut chutney. Bisi Bele Bath:

A traditional dish from Karnataka, Bisi Bele Bath is a one-pot meal made from rice, lentils, and vegetables, cooked together with a flavourful spice mix. The name literally means "hot lentil rice," and it's a perfect example of comfort food, often served with ghee, papad, or raita. The blend of tangy, spicy, and slightly sweet flavours makes this dish a favorite in South Indian homes.



Pani Puri:

A celebrated street food snack across India, Pani Puri consists of crispy, hollow puris filled with spicy, tangy tamarind water and mashed potatoes or chickpeas. Also known as golgappa or puchka in different regions, each bite of pani puri is an explosion of flavours. This snack is often enjoyed at roadside stalls, where it's served fresh and customized to taste.

Pav Bhaii:

Hailing from the streets of Mumbai, Pav Bhaji is a hearty vegetable mash cooked with tomatoes, peas, potatoes, and a special blend of spices, served with buttered pav (bread roll). The spiced, buttery bhaji (vegetable curry) is bursting with flavours and is often topped with onions, coriander, and a squeeze of lemon. This iconic street food has gained popularity across India and is now a household favourite for dinner or a quick snack.





Vangi Bath:

Vangi Bath is a flavourful rice dish made with brinjal (eggplant), spices, and tamarind. This Karnataka specialty combines cooked rice with a special masala blend and sautéed eggplant, resulting in a tangy and spicy rice dish. Often garnished with peanuts or coconut, Vangi Bath is a popular lunch option, typically enjoyed with yogurt or raita.


