
3. GANESH GALLI MUMBAICHA RAJA (PAREL):

2. West Bengal: The Grandeur of **Durga Puja Artistry**

In West Bengal, Durga Puja is an art lover's paradise. The festival is known for its elaborate pandals, which are temporary structures that house the idols of Goddess Durga. Ghatsthapana and Apta Leaves In Maharashtra, the cultural aspect of Navratri is seen in practices like Ghatsthapana, where a pot symbolizing the goddess is installed, and in the exchange of Apta leaves on Dussehra, symbolizing prosperity and goodwill. The apta leaves are often exchanged with a traditional Marathi poem or greeting, reflecting the cultural emphasis on literature and poetry in the region.

Dussehra in Maharashtra also sees the performance of traditional dances like Lavani, and the recitation of heroic tales from the region's history, connecting the festival to the Maratha warrior tradition and celebrating the cultural heritage of the state.

Navratri and Dussehra are not just religious festivals; they are a celebration of India's diverse cultural heritage. The art forms, whether in the form of dance, music, theatre, or craftsmanship, reflect the rich traditions of different regions, while also adapting to contemporary influences. A JOURNEY THROUGH INDIA'S

Divide a solution of the most widely celebrated festivals in India and among Indian communities worldwide. Known as the Festival of Lights, Diwali signifies the victory of light over darkness and good over evil. It is a time of joy, family gatherings, and deep cultural significance, reflecting the rich traditions and unity of the Indian people.

History of the Festival

Diwali, celebrated during the Hindu lunisolar month of Ashvin (typically falling in October-November), has its origins rooted in various mythological and historical events. The festival commemorates the return of Lord Rama to his kingdom of Ayodhya after defeating the demon king Ravana, as narrated in the epic Ramayana. The people of Ayodhya welcomed Rama by illuminating the city with diyas (oil lamps), symbolizing the triumph of light over darkness. In addition to this, Diwali is associated with goddess Lakshmi, the deity of wealth and prosperity, and her annual visit to homes during this time.

How is it celebrated?

Diwali is celebrated with immense enthusiasm and elaborate festivities. The celebration lasts for five days, each with its own significance and traditions:



- **Dhanteras:** The festival begins with Dhanteras, dedicated to the worship of Lord Dhanvantari, the god of health and wealth. People clean their homes and purchase new items, especially metal objects, to welcome prosperity.
- Naraka Chaturdashi (Choti Diwali): The second day marks the victory of Lord Krishna over the demon Narakasura. People decorate their homes with rangoli (colourful patterns made from powders and flowers) and light diyas.



- Diwali (Deepavali): The main day of Diwali involves lighting oil lamps, bursting fireworks, and performing religious rituals to honour Lakshmi, the goddess of wealth. Homes are decorated with diyas and fairy lights, and families gather for a festive meal.
- Govardhan Puja: The fourth day celebrates Lord Krishna's lifting of the Govardhan Hill to protect the villagers from a storm. It involves preparing and offering a special dish called "Annakut" or "Govardhan Prasad".
- Bhai Dooj: Diwali concludes with Bhai Dooj, a day dedicated to the bond between brothers and sisters.
 Sisters perform a ritual to wish for their brother's well-being, and brothers give gifts in return.



Symbols and Traditions

Diwali is rich in symbols and traditions that capture its essence. The lighting of diyas and fireworks symbolizes the triumph of light over darkness. Rangoli designs, made from coloured powders or flowers, adorn homes and public spaces, representing the festive spirit and inviting positive energies. Traditional attire, often in vibrant colours, adds to the visual splendour of the celebrations. Temples and homes are decorated with strings of lights, and the exchange of sweets and gifts reinforces the sense of joy and togetherness.

Festival Food and Cuisine

Diwali is also renowned for its delectable range of festive foods. The celebration brings together a variety of traditional sweets and savoury dishes:

Sweets: Popular sweets include gulab jamun (deep-fried milk balls soaked in sugar syrup), jalebi (crispy, syrup-soaked rings), barfi (a sweet confection made from condensed milk and various flavourings), and ladoos (sweet, round balls made from chickpea flour or semolina).

Savoury Snacks: Savoury treats like samosas (spiced potato-filled pastries), chivda (spiced flattened rice), and pakoras (deep-fried fritters) are enjoyed during Diwali gatherings. In the Spotlight

What's the most Q unusual or unexpected

thing you've seen from the cockpit?

A. I witnessed a rare meteorological phenomenon known as the 'Green Flash'. This usually occurs at sunrise or sunset and is a brief flash of green light that can occur just before the sun dips below the horizon.

Q Do you have any preflight rituals or routines that help you get in the zone?

A. I try and make sure that my uniform and personal appearance are neat and professional, which can contribute to a confident mindset. I also try and maintain a positive and focused mindset, which can enhance my performance and decision-making.

What's your favourite Q city or destination to fly into, and why?

A. Belagavi, it's my home town and nothing makes one happy coming back home. Belagavi, located in Karnataka, India, is surrounded by several interesting places to visit, which offer a mix of historical, cultural, and natural experiences, and great options for day trips or short getaways.

How do you unwind after Q a long flight?

A. Depending on the time of arrival, I follow a few ways to unwind. First off, light exercise can help or a good book and some music will be relaxing. Khaman Dhokla:

A guintessential snack from Gujarat, Khaman Dhokla is a light and fluffy steamed cake made from fermented chickpea flour (besan). This savoury delight is seasoned with mustard seeds, curry leaves, and green chillies, offering a perfect balance of flavours. Often garnished with fresh coriander and grated coconut, Khaman Dhokla is a popular choice for breakfast or as a teatime snack.

Undhiyu:

Undhiyu is a hearty and flavourful mixed vegetable dish that is a staple in Gujarat, especially during winter months. It features a medley of seasonal vegetables, including potatoes, sweet potatoes, and fenugreek dumplings, cooked with a blend of aromatic spices. This one-pot dish is traditionally slow-cooked in an earthen pot, allowing the flavours to meld together beautifully.

Fafda-Jalebi:




